

SAN DIEGO BEFORE STATEHOOD

Junípero Serra Museum – Presidio Park

Journey back in time and tread in the footsteps of the padres, soldiers and settlers who established the first mission and presidio in Alta California. Through a combination of museum educator/docent-facilitated or teacher-led activities, explore a section of Presidio Park, learning about the plaza, stables, jail, chapel and commander's house that lie protected underground today.

Inside the Serra Museum, investigate artifacts that reveal the daily life of the Kumeyaay, the Spanish and the Mexican inhabitants of early California. "Meet" real historic figures by dressing in costume as Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo, Father Junípero Serra, Guillermo Carrillo, Señorita Pico, and Josefa Carillo de Fitch, all important leaders in the early years of the city.

NOTE: The Junípero Serra Museum is currently not ADA accessible.

Grade Levels: Elementary; Middle

Program Fee: \$7 per student / Title One funding available

Free for teachers and chaperones on an 8:1 ratio. Additional chaperones beyond the 8:1 ratio pay the student price. All reservations require a non-refundable \$10 registration fee due within two weeks of scheduling your date.

Dates Offered: Tuesdays and Thursdays, September – July

Time: 9:30 - 11:30am

Maximum Number of Students: One class preferred. Up to two classes can be accommodated with the outside/grounds portion being self-guided by teachers and chaperones (materials and resources available to teachers and chaperones during the visit).
